The Catholic Church can trace its beginning back to Matthew 16:18, when Jesus said to Peter, " . . . [Y]ou are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, . . ."

The Church has many members and exists throughout the world. It needs good leadership. The Pope, bishops, priests, and deacons lead the Church, helping its members serve Christ and his Gospel of love.

The Pope is the supreme head of the worldwide Catholic Church. Bishops are appointed by the Pope to lead a diocese, a group of parishes. Priests support bishops by pastoring the parishes in a diocese. Deacons support priests in their ministry to the parish. Many other women, men, and children support the deacons and priests by being a part of various Church ministries.


diocese

Feast Days: The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica



Throughout the Church year Catholics celebrate solemnities, feasts, and memorials in honor of events in the lives of Jesus. the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the Saints. In addition, there are feasts that celebrate other important events in the life of the Church. One such feast is the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, celebrated on November 9th. The Lateran Basilica. also known as Saint John Lateran Basilica. is the Pope's cathedral. It is in Rome. On its exterior is written omnium ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis mater et caput, which means "mother and head of all churches of Rome and the world."
