



Deepen

The RCIA journey is a journey that has led you to the Sacrament of Baptism, through which you became a child of God. How have you seen or felt God the Father's love for you? How can you show your love for God the Father?

With your family, talk about what it means to be a child of God. Think about ways to show others you are a child of God through your actions and through your words. Write your ideas below.



Meditate

Sheep recognize their own shepherd's voice. They will not respond to any other voices. Jesus is our Good Shepherd. His alone is the voice that guides us along the right path and leads us to peace and safety.

With your family, think about the many ways Jesus speaks to you. Talk about what helps you to listen to and to hear his voice. Then talk about what makes it hard to listen to and to hear his voice. Make a sign of the cross over each family member's ears, praying, "Lord, open our ears to hear your voice."

Unless you live on a farm, you may not have contact with a lot of animals, especially sheep. You may not have seen for yourself just how important a shepherd is to the sheep.

You might, however, know about GPS devices. GPS tells us or shows us the way to get to where we want to go. It helps keep us from getting lost. This is what shepherds do for the sheep. This is what Jesus, through the Church, does for us. He leads us on the right path and guides us to our heavenly home.
