## **Church Teaching**

#### For the Glory of God

God is the master of this world and of history. He creates out of nothing and with no help. With infinite wisdom, God created a world which constantly reveals his ultimate perfection, his goodness, truth, and beauty. He is present to his creation, upholding and sustaining it while transcending it as its totally free and sovereign Creator.

God created an ordered and good world which shares in his goodness. Out of infinite love, God bestows life upon us, his creatures, making us his sons and daughters in Jesus Christ, for the sole purpose of praising his glory and graciousness. Creation does not increase God's blessedness or further his perfection, for he is blessed and perfect in himself.

#### Serving and Loving Him

Body and soul, we are created in God's image and likeness. In other words, we are not *something* but someone. We are persons capable of knowing our Creator, of freely responding to his invitation to love him, and of sharing in his love and own life.

God created humanity male and female in perfect equality as persons who have been created to live in community. God willed that they be together to find and live in a communion of help and love. By transmitting life to children, men and women cooperate together as spouses and parents in the Creator's work.

Fruitful and good, the world has not only been created for our benefit and use but has been entrusted to our care. We render back this creation to God, serving and loving him through our good stewardship of his many gifts.
